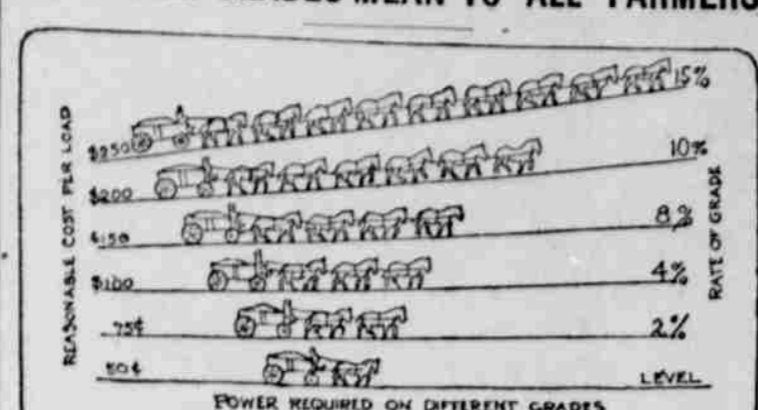

GOOD ROADS

Meeting at Atlantic City Marks Epoch in History.

Most Important Feature Was Attempt to Find Ways and Means to Stop Tremendous Drain on Revenues—Subjects Discussed.

The first national road congress held at Atlantic City, N. J., October 1-5 marks an epoch in the history of good roads.

GOOD ROAD CONGRESS

The first two days of the congress were road users' days, so called, and the program was under the direction of the American Automobile association.

National old trails was discussed in a paper by Judge J. M. Lowe of St. Louis and by Mrs. Donald McLean, honorary president-general of the D. A. R.

Among the other speakers up to the time covered by the third day of the congress were Col. W. D. Sohler of Massachusetts, who advised uniform road making laws; H. W. Anderson of Richmond, Va., who discussed needed reforms in road legislation.

JUMPING KANGAROO IS FUNNY
