The commission appointed by Governor West to prepare a Workmen's Compensation Act has reported to the Governor a bill which will be presented to the Legislature next month. The ission consisted of three nen from the Labor Unions, three from the Employers Association and three from the Grange. Some of the important features of the bill have beem gmmed up by The Timberman of Portland as follows:

The law proposed contemplates the creation of a State Industrial Commission composed of three members and charged with the dministration of the act. This Industrial Commission receives the money payable under the act and deposits it with the state treasurer. Whenever a claim is allowed on account of death or claimant to receive an allowance by way of monthly installments for a period of two years or more. it becomes the duty of the state treasurer to set apart a sum sufficient in view of the life expectancy of the claimant, if the installments are to continue for life or for the period fixed by the act, if the allowance be for an injury, as will meet the monthly installments thereafter to fall due. Such funds so set apart are required to be invested in securities of the class authorized for the investment of funds by savings banks under the laws of this state, thus absolutely guaranteeing the payment of the install-

The act contains a schedule of allowances for death, total permanent disability and various permanent partial disabilities, and instruction of the act.
