County Court
Proceedings

Be it remembered, that a regu-
lar term of the County Court of the
State of Oregon, for Columbia Co.,
was begun and held at the Court
House in the City of St. Helens, in
said county and state on Thursday,
Jan. 1913, Wednesday having been
a legal holiday, the same being the
time fixed by law for holding a
regular term of said court, when
were present: Hon. James Dart,
County Judge; Hon. W. K. Tiche-
nor, Commissioner; Hon. John Farr,
Commissioner; H. E. LaBare, Clerk;
A. E. Thompson, Sheriff.

Due proclamation being made,
the following proceedings were had:
Journal read, approved and signed.
Matter of petition of Walter Hun-
ter for liquor license for Goble pre-
cinct:
On this 2nd day of January, 1913,
comes on for hearing the petition of
Walter Hunter for a license to sell
spirituous, vinous and malt liquors
and fermented cider in less quanti-
ties than one gallon, in Goble pre-
cinct for the period of six months;
and it satisfactorily appearing to
the court from proofs filed herein,
that due notice of the pendency of
this proceeding has been given as
by law required; that petitioner has
not been convicted of wilfully sell-
ing or delivering spirituous, vinous,
fermented or malt liquors to a minor
or of wilfully allowing a minor to
inlet in or about any place where
such liquors are sold or disposed of;
And it further appearing to the
court that said petition contains the
signatures of a majority of all the
legal voters of said precinct who are
actual residents thereof, and who
have actually resided therein at
least thirty days immediately
preceding the signing and presenta-
tion of said petition.

And the said petitioner having
filed with the clerk of this court a
bond duly approved by the County
Judge, and also having filed a dupli-
cate receipt of the County Treasurer
in the sum of \$200, and the court
being advised in the premises, it is
ordered by the court that said peti-
tion be granted, and that license
issue to the said Walter Hunter, to
sell spirituous, vinous and malt
liquors and fermented cider in less
quantities than one gallon in Goble
precinct, for the period of six months
from the 7th day of January, 1913.
Matter of deed for county road:
On this day there comes on for
consideration that certain deed from
Antone and Theresa Peterson, for-
ever dedicating to the county for
road purposes a certain strip of
land as heretofore viewed and plat-
ted, and the court being advised in
the matter it is ordered by the court
that said deed be and the same be
so approved. It is further or-
dered by the court that the Clerk
be and he is hereby instructed to
file said deed for record.
Matter of scamp bounty claims:
On this day the Clerk presents to
the court the verified claims of
Charles Wallis, being claim No. 50
for \$10 for one cougar; G. A. Clark,
being claim No. 51 for \$2 for one
wildcat; and I. C. Morris, being
claim No. 52 for \$1.50 for one
coyote, and the court being ad-
vised in the matter, it is ordered by
the court that said claims be and
the same are hereby approved.

Road Viewers upon the proposed
change in Rainier-Beaver valley
road, in accordance with duly
executed deeds from the Rainier
Land Co., Geo. F. Moeck et ux
and Dean Stehman et ux, hereto-
fore duly presented herein, and it
appearing to the court that said
proposed change would be of
public utility, the report of the
Board of County Road Viewers
being favorable, and no objection
or claim for damages being filed
or presented herein, and the court
being fully advised, it is ordered
by the court that said report be
accepted, and that said report,
profile, plat and field notes, to-
gether with said deeds be duly
recorded, and from thenceforth
said road shall be a public high-
way. It is further ordered by
the court that the road super-
visor in whose district said road
is located shall open the same for
public travel.
