## Ordinance No. 135

An Ordinance apportioning the cost of improving Casenan street, in the City of St. Helens, Ore., between the northern boundary of St. Helens street and the southern boundary of Willamette street, by the widening of the same for the full width of 80 feet, and paving the same with crushed rock for a width of 8 feet on each side of the center line of said improved portion, and assessing the cost of said improvement to the property benefited thereby.

Whereas, under and by direction of the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, upon petition of the property owners thereof, all that portion of Casenan street between the northern boundary of St. Helens street and the southern boundary of Willamette street, in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, has been improved by grading the same to the full width of 80 feet, and paving the same with crushed rock for a width of 8 feet on each side of the center line of said street; and it having been duly ascertained that the cost of said improvement is the sum of \$1809.65, which sum has already been paid by said city, and for which said city has not been reimbursed;

And whereas, under the charter of said city it is required and directed that the cost of such improvement shall fall upon the property abutting thereon, to-wit: Upon lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 in block 17, and lots 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22, in block 27, all in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, and be apportioned upon the said described property according to the value of the real estate only, as determined by the last previous county assessment.

Now, therefore, in accordance with the provisions of said charter, the city of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following sums be and the same hereby are apportioned as the assessment against the respective lots abutting upon said improvement of Casenan street in the City of St. Helens, between the northern boundary of St. Helens street and the southern boundary of Willamette street, in the preamble hereof, particularly set forth, among the respective owners of said lots, and that the said sums set against the number of the lots so abutting on said improvement, and be and the same hereby are assessed to the lots so designated, apportioned among the property owners so named, according to the laws of said city, to-wit:
