## County Court Proceedings

Wednesday, Jan. 8, 1913, 6th Ju-  
dicial day.

Court came pursuant to adjourn-  
ment.  
Officers all present.

Due proclamation being made, the  
following proceedings were had:  
Matter of Undertaking of A. E.  
Thompson, Sheriff.

On this day A. E. Thompson  
presents to the Court his official  
undertaking in the sum of \$10,000,  
and an additional undertaking in  
the sum of \$3000 as tax collector,  
which said undertakings are duly  
approved by the court.

Matter of drawing jury list:  
On this day the court completes  
the selection of the jury list, com-  
posed of 200 names selected from  
the tax roll as by law provided.

Matter of aid to Jutila family:  
On this day it is ordered by the  
court that the Clerk be and he is  
hereby instructed to issue a general  
fund warrant in favor of Thos.  
Basse, in the sum of \$20 for aid of  
Jutila family.

Whereupon, Court adjourned un-  
til Thursday, Jan. 9, 1913.

Officers all present.

Due proclamation being made the  
following proceedings were had:  
Matter of tax levy for years 1912  
and 1913, and of the estimated  
amounts to be raised for the several  
purposes:

On this 9th day of January, 1913,  
this matter coming on for the con-  
sideration of the court, and it ap-  
pearing to the court from the esti-  
mates now made that it will be  
necessary to raise \$18,432.25 for  
state purposes; \$28,496 for school  
purposes; \$356.20 for library; \$72.97  
for S. and S. indigent fund;  
\$40,092.20 for county; \$48,785.04  
for general road.

And it appearing to the court that  
the total amount of assessable prop-  
erty of the county, as appears by  
the assessment rolls for the year  
1912, is \$14,595,015.00.

That in order to raise the afore-  
said amounts for the state, school,  
library and S. and S. indigent fund  
and county purposes, it will be  
necessary to levy a tax of 6 mills  
upon all the assessable property of  
the county, and to raise the sum of  
\$43,785.04, for general road pur-  
poses it will be necessary to levy a  
tax of 3 mills upon all the assessable  
property within the county.

It is therefore ordered by the  
Court that a levy of 6 mills on the  
dollar, divided as follows: For state  
purposes, .001263; for school .00156;  
for library, .000025; for S. and S.  
indigent fund, .000006; for county,  
.002747, be, and the same is hereby  
levied upon all the assessable prop-  
erty within the county of Colum-  
bia.

And it is further ordered by the  
court that a tax levy of 3 mills on  
the dollar on all assessable prop-  
erty within the county be and the  
same is hereby levied for road pur-  
poses.

Matter of resolution of road dis-  
trict No. 15 for special improve-  
ments and levy of tax to defray the  
expense of same:

On this day this matter coming  
on for consideration upon the report  
of the special road meeting in said  
district No. 15, and notice to the  
court of the levy of 7 1-2 mills made  
by said district, as a special tax, it  
is ordered by the court that said  
resolutions and levy be, and they  
are hereby approved.

Matter of appointment of road  
supervisor for road district No. 15:  
On this day it appearing to the  
court that at a special meeting of  
the taxpayers of said road district  
No. 15, Mr. M. J. John was desig-  
nated for recommendation to the  
court for supervisor for said dis-  
trict, it is therefore ordered by the  
court that the order heretofore  
made appointing Mr. Gust Gustaf-  
son, be, and the same is hereby set  
aside and hold for naught and that  
Mr. M. J. John be and he is hereby  
appointed supervisor for said road  
district No. 15.

Matter of appointment and qual-  
ification of deputy sheriff:

On this day A. B. Lake presents  
to the court his certificate of ap-  
pointment to the office of deputy  
sheriff, with his oath of office en-  
dorsed thereon, duly subscribed to  
by him, as by law provided, and

You are hereby further ordered  
to keep a strict account of all  
expenditures and report same in  
such manner that the court may  
at any time determine the ex-  
penditure on any particular piece  
of work.

You are hereby further ordered  
not to make any expenditures  
from any fund in excess of the  
amount of the funds apportioned  
or available.
