Ann Reed, a longtime resident of Silverton, said her goodbyes to her family and died peacefully in the early morning hours of Monday, March 21, in her home of two and a half years at Mt. Angel Towers. She was three weeks shy of her 93rd birthday.

Ann was born in West Frankfort, Illinois, daughter of English immigrants Michael and Catherine (Quayle) Lynch. She was the sixth of ten children, the half of a set of identi-

cal twins. She and her sister Margaret always shared a very close relationship. Ann graduated from Frankfort Community High School in West Frankfort. The family moved to Silverton on S Water St. shortly after many of the coal mines were shutting down and work was hard to find.

While working as a projectionist at the Palace Theater, Ann was introduced to Carl Reed while he was on leave from the Army Air Corps during WWII. He was a B-25 pilot in the Pacific, and their relationship blossomed while writing letters back and forth. Carl even named his plane "Annie." They were married on Nov. 8, 1946. Ann settled into her life as housewife and mother to four children, one boy and three

girls. Ann and her mother were two of the founding members of St. Edwards Episcopal Church in Silverton and was active in the Women's Guild. She enjoyed her Thursday evenings out with her longtime bowling team and continued to bowl into her 80s. She also enjoyed sewing, crocheting, and china painting.

When her last child was into her teens, she took on a part-time job as assistant cook at Robert Frost Elementary School.

She enjoyed cooking Sunday dinners for the family and hosting the Fourth of July picnics at their farm on Silverton Road.

Ann is survived by her husband of almost 70 years, Carl; her three daughters, Linda (Herb)

Romey, Cindy (Larry) Key, and Cheryl (Rick) Rue; daughter-in-law Cindy Reed; twelve grandchildren; and twenty-five great grandchildren. She is preceded in death by her son, Carl, Jr.

Visitation will be from 3 to 8 p.m., Friday, April 1, 2016, at Unger Funeral Chapel in Silverton. A funeral service will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday, April 2, 2016, at St. Edwards Episcopal Church, followed by a reception in the parish hall. ment of Environmental Quality. "In none of them have we picked up any diesel product."

Testing will continue but less frequently, Brown said.

AT&T hired NFFF Environmental of Philomath to clean up the site, according to DEQ documents.

Beginning Feb. 12, absorbent booms and pads were used to capture some of the diesel.

Then, about 41 cubic yards of soil was removed and taken to the

Waste Management River Bend Landfill in McMinnville.

Diesel also accumulated on top of a bedrock outcrop about 40 feet downhill from the release area.

Soil on top of the outcrop will be excavated by hand about one foot deep to bedrock, according to the documents.

The job was made more difficult by heavy snow on the 13-mile logging road used to access the site.

Now, AT&T will use enzyme products to help degrade remaining diesel at the site, Brown said.

"We've had a lot of surface water sampling..in none of them have we picked up any diesel product."
