Jack Warren Coskey
Oct. 8, 1918 — April 30, 2016

Jack Warren Coskey, 97, of Corvallis and former resident of Silverton, Oregon and Hillsboro, Oregon and Renton and Centralia, Washington, died April 30, 2016 in Corvallis. He was born on October 8, 1918 in Seattle, Washington to Arthur and Laura Mildred Coskey, the elder of two children. He married Kathryn May Priest on August 1, 1947, in Tacoma, Washington, and they were blessed with four children.

A World War II army captain, Jack served with the 1288th Engineer Combat Battalion. In Germany, his battalion cleared a personnel-mine field and constructed a floating Bailey bridge across the Rhine River. The bridge helped move allied forces into central Germany for the final allied ground assault. Jack was a graduate forester and land surveyor from the University of Washington and remained a proud Husky fan.

His professional career spanned over 40 years, including working at a shake mill, forester for the Milwaukee Land Company, licensed land surveyor, timber tax economist for the Industrial Forestry Association, and forestry and surveying instructor at Chemeketa Community College.

An avid outdoorsman, Jack enjoyed surveying Washington and Oregon forests, traveling, hunting, target shooting, landscaping, gardening, and raising sheep. He was an avid reader of history, natural sciences, and travel. Many years ago he typed a letter to his children on Father's Day telling them that of all the things he had done, having a family of his own and

watching the children grow had been his most satisfying. Jack's family will treasure his many typed and handwritten letters in his very precise and distinctive cursive penmanship.

Survivors include his four children: Thomas (Julie) Coskey of Fairbanks, Alaska; James (Valerie) Coskey of Philomath, Oregon; Mary (Steve) Cooper of Florence, Arizona; and Ann (Richard) Wasserman of Salem, Oregon; 12 grandchildren; 6 great-grandchildren. His wife, Kathryn Coskey, parents, brother, and granddaughter, preceded him in death.

Private burial for Jack Warren Coskey will be at Willamette National Cemetery on May 12, 2016 at 10:30 am in Portland, Oregon.

Mildred (Mickey) Carolyn Volker

Mildred (Mickey) Carolyn Volker died Thursday, May 5, 2016 in Mt. Angel, Oregon. She was 101 years old.

Mildred Carolyn Ketter was born February 15, 1915 in Kelly, Kansas to John and Clara Ketter. Mildred had one sister, Frances, and one brother, Celestine. The family soon moved to Frankfort, Kansas so John could rent and work on various farms. Mildred lived in Frankfort until she finished 8th grade. She did not want to attend high school, but her older sister, Frances, believed she should go. Frances contacted their parents and asked them to send Mildred to Wichita, where Frances was living.

Frances put Mildred in Mt. Carmel, an all-girls school, where she attended for one year. While Mildred was in Wichita, the family moved to St. Francis, Kansas. Mildred joined them there and finished high school in St. Francis.

Mildred's brother, Celestine, often attended dances with his friend, Orville Volker. One day, Celestine and Orville went with a horse trailer to pick up Mildred from a friend's house. On the way back, Mildred held a song book for Orville while he played his guitar, and they soon started seeing each other.

Orville traveled to Oregon to find work and eventually found a job at a saw mill in Scotts Mills. He worked for a year and then traveled back to Kansas for Mildred. Orville and Mildred were married June 14, 1937 in St. Francis, and then traveled to Oregon. Orville and Mildred lived for five years in Scotts Mills before moving to Silverton, Oregon.

In Silverton, Mildred worked at home raising their three children, Allen, Linda, and Dennis. She spent her time cooking and baking (she was well-known for her amazing pies), and entertaining friends in their large backyard. Mildred especially loved having family reunions.

Later, Mildred worked as a clerk at Goodwill in Silverton until she retired.

She was also very involved with St. Paul Catholic Church. Mildred enjoyed playing card games and working in her garden, spent time crocheting afghans for all her loved ones, and loved spending time with family. She was known to always have beautiful flow-

ers growing in her yard and even mowed her own lawn while in her 90s. Above all, Mildred will most be remembered for her wonderful sense of humor.

She is survived by her three children: Allen Volker (wife Karen), Linda Brochard (husband Harry), and Dennis Volker; her eight grandchildren: Jon Brochard, Gina Brochard, Denise Brochard, Eric Volker, Heidi Tavares, Scott Volker, Crystal Nekvapil, and Jason Volker; and her 10 great grandchildren. Austin, Carter, Addison, Alivia, Kai, Hayden, Elizabeth, Wyatt, Claire, and Audrey. She is preceded in death by her parents, John and Clara, her siblings, Frances and Celestine, and her husband, Orville.

A viewing was held at Unger Funeral Chapel in Silverton on Friday, May 13 from 3 to 8 p.m. Funeral services were held on Saturday, May 14 at 2 p.m. at St. Paul Catholic Church in Silverton, followed by a grave site service at St. Paul Catholic Cemetery. Reception followed at Mt. Angel Towers at 3:30.
