STATEMENT OF CHANGES IN ACTIVITIES and SOURCES OF FINANCING *

The FY 16-17 budget was again prepared with attention paid to the fiscally conservative nature of our community. This proposed budget is again, "status quo" with only modest increases in some program line items to support investments made in existing services or facilities as directly by the Council. While Mt. Angel fared well through the recession, at every turn there is a program, facility or service that needs additional investment if the City is to realize a higher standard of living for its residents and future generations of Mt. Angel families. Typically, the budget is determined in conjunction with goals and priorities established by the City Council for the coming year. This budget include the following decision packages:

- Increase of 2 % in Telephone and PGE franchise fees, and Business registration fee of \$50.
- Additional staff hours for the Library and a new PW UWI position.
- Water rate increase of 15% and Sewer rate increase of 10%.
- A Street light fee of \$2 per location and a \$3 Stormwater fee per ERU.

Key Economic Factors and Assumptions: Property tax revenue was projected with a modest increase of 2%, population was projected 3,410, staffing increased 1.2 FTE in Library and Public Works. COLAs are proposed in the amount of 1.1% based on the Portland CPI-U for the 2nd half of the previous year. Health care benefit premiums are estimated to increase 7.8% and full time employees will continue to pay 10% of health care premiums. The City considers a 30 hour employees to be eligible for health insurance at a prorated amount. PERS contribution rates for Tier 1 & 2 are 10.68% and OPSRP is 5.20% for General Service and 9.31% for Police. Property and liability insurance is projected to increase an average of 9%. The main capital project in the budget is Monroe/Marquam waterline. All projects are funded with existing revenues, no outside sources of financing are proposed. The city has no outside debt. The budget proposed by the budget officer and amended by the budget committee was \$8,446,149.

Notice of Receipt of Ballot Title

Notice is hereby given that a ballot title for a City Council referred measure was filed with the Elections Officer of the City of Mt. Angel on December 7, 2015.

Electors may submit a petition for review of this ballot title in the Marion County Circuit Court no later than 5:00 p.m. on June 3, 2016.

The text of the ballot title is as follows:

CAPTION: Prohibiting Certain Recreational and Medical Marijuana Facilities in Mt. Angel

QUESTION: Shall Mt. Angel prohibit medical marijuana dispensaries, medical marijuana processing sites, marijuana producers, marijuana processors, marijuana wholesalers and marijuana retailers?

SUMMARY: If adopted by the voters, this measure would prohibit the establishment of medical marijuana dispensaries, medical marijuana processing sites, marijuana producers, marijuana processors, marijuana wholesalers and marijuana retailers within the City of Mt. Angel. This measure would not prohibit medical marijuana grows within the City. If this measure is approved by the voters, under current state law the City of Mt. Angel would not be eligible to receive distributions of state marijuana tax revenues, or to adopt a city tax on recreational retail marijuana sales.

Notice is also hereby given that a regular city election will be held in the City of Mt. Angel on November 8, 2016.

STANDARD FAMILY LAW RESTRAINING ORDERS
Starting immediately, you and your spouse or domestic partner are restrained from:

- removing the minor children of the parties from the state or applying for a new or replacement passport for those minor children without the prior written consent of the other party or an order of the court;
- cashing, borrowing against, canceling, transferring, disposing of, or changing the beneficiaries of any insurance of other coverage, including life, health, automobile, and disability, held for the benefit of the parties and their minor children;
- transferring, encumbering, hypothecating, concealing, or in any way disposing of any property, real or personal, whether community, quasi-community, or separate, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life; and
- creating a nonprobate transfer or modifying a nonprobate transfer in a manner that affects the disposition of property subject to the transfer, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court. Before revocation of a nonprobate transfer can take effect or a right of survivorship to property can be eliminated, notice of the change must be filed and served on the other party.

You must notify each other of any proposed extraordinary expenditures at least five business days prior to incurring these extraordinary expenditures and account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after these restraining orders are effective. However, you may use community property, quasi-community property, or your own separate property to pay an attorney to help you or to pay court costs.
