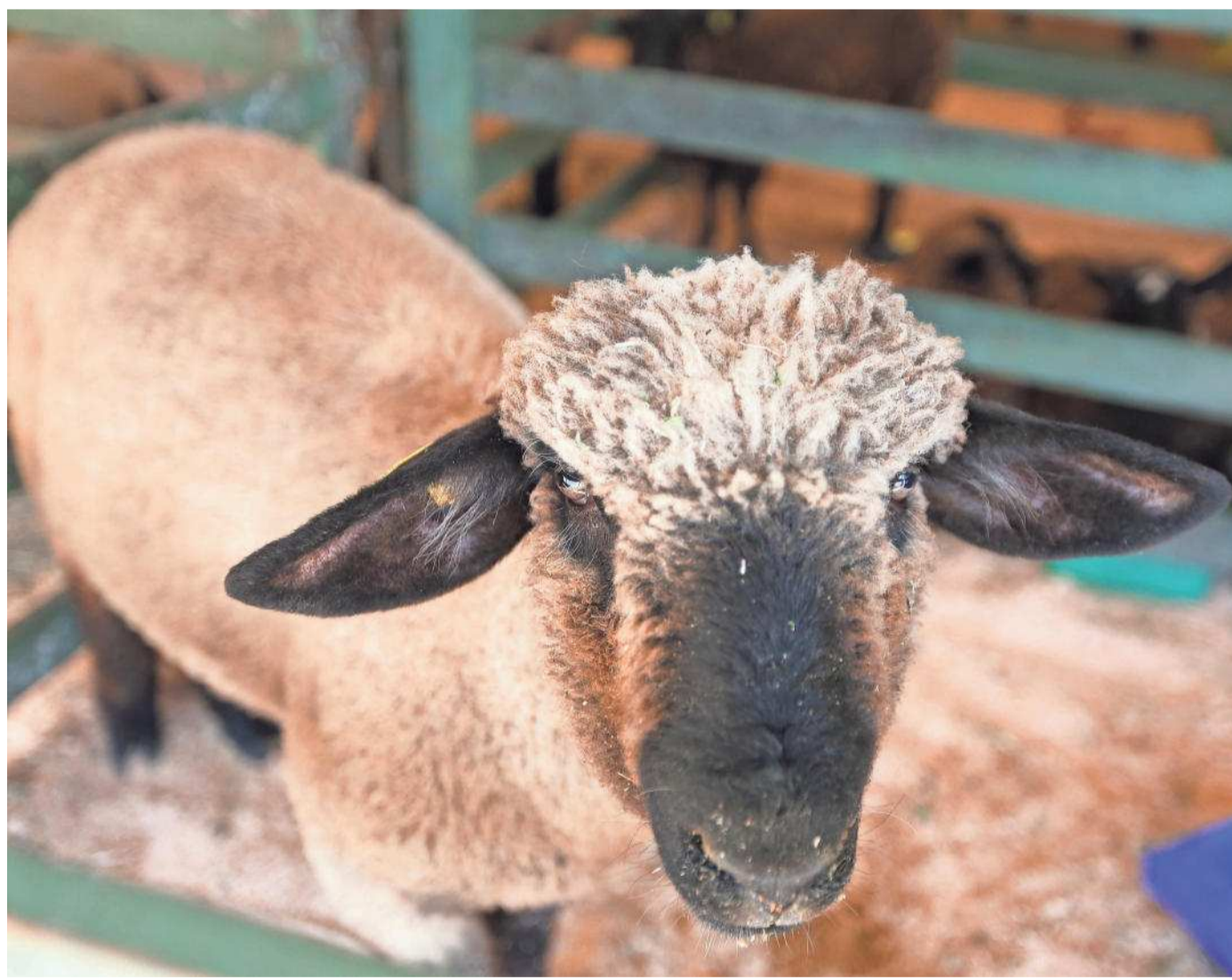
Turner celebrated wool and feathers this year during the 79th Annual Marion County Lamb & Wool Show Saturday, June 4.
