Kickin' up dust at Santiam Canyon Stampede

High-octane entertainment will be on hand when the 20th Annual Santiam Canyon Stampede rolls into the Sublimity Harvest Festival Grounds this weekend.

The gates will open at 5:30 p.m. both Friday and Saturday evening, in time for people age 21 and old-

er to start the night with games and prizes at the Stampede Tailgate party from 5:45 - 6:45. Meanwhile, youngsters can enjoy the Kids Corral (free on Friday, courtesy of Sublimity Insurance), where pony rides, miniature donkey cart rides, inflatable games, face painting, games, photo opportunities and prizes will be offered.

The real action kicks in at 7 p.m. when the National Professional Rodeo Association rodeo takes over the grounds, with bareback riding, roping events, steer wrestling, barrel racing, saddle bronc riding and bull riding highlighted. Even the kids get to be involved with mutton busting and junior barrel racing.

At the end of the evening, the Stampede After Party (21+) features live music from the band Country Wide.

One aspect that makes the Santiam Canyon Stampede stand out from traditional rodeos is the inclusion of freestyle motocross (FMX). Cowboys of a different sort, Metal Mulisha riders Justin Homan and Sean Nielson will take to the sky performing daredevil aerial maneuvers following the roundup competitions.

"We thought that the extreme motocross was a good meld with the rodeo as they're both very adrenaline driven," Stampede Director of Promotions Corky Justis said.

"Moreover, Justin's been a great fit," she added.

"He is great with the kids, always sitting down and chatting with them afterward and signing autographs. He's very family-oriented and that's what our event is about."

Homan, who has participated in the Stampede for "about 10 years," is an X Games Bronze Medalist, two-time X Games Champion and 14-time X Games finalist.

"I grew up doing a lot of motocross racing and was always a very technical rider and a good jumper," he said. "I started doing FMX when it was officially recognized as a sport in 1997. But it's like jumping out of an airplane or gymnastics. You have to ease into it and it's a lot of time and hard work."

"It's really exciting for an audience to see it in real life. It's much different than on t.v. You can tell that we really are over 40 feet in the air doing flips and spins."

Justis said that one of the new elements they will be adding this year is a race-off between Homan and rodeo performers.

"Justin will be competing against the barrel racers to see who is the fastest," she said.

Although Homan competes or performs in shows nearly every weekend and suffered severe injuries during one of his first years here, the Stampede is one of his favorites.

"I really like the rodeo element and all the music," he said. "It makes it a lot of fun. It's a great venue and a great audience."

After all these thrills, make a weekend of it at the Cowboy Breakfast from 7 a.m. to noon, Saturday and Sunday, at the Sublimity Fire Station, 115 NW Parker St. Cost is \$5 for adults 13 - 54, \$3 ages 4 - 12 and 55+, under 4 free. Proceeds will benefit the Volunteer Firefighters Association.

Pulling all of these elements together, the Stampede Board is quite pleased with the reception the event has gotten.

"We've been growing year to year," Justis said. "The support we get from businesses and the community is amazing. People are loving it more and more and we're always trying to offer something new to give back."
