changing local signage — which now touts the high school baseball team's 2012 state win — to include the girls' basketball team among others.

While talking, Jinez makes the kind of eye contact that would make a speech teacher proud. Extremely self-aware, he also forces himself to slow down. Spanish is his native language, and, if he's not careful, he knows he'll talk too quickly in English. Altogether, he appears calm and confident, a stack of papers before him and a pen tucked over his right ear.

"Most of the time, I'm

trying to listen and learn something new," Jinez said. "I try to keep an open mind."

With that attitude and a dose of political experience (he is Kennedy High School's student body president) Jinez is just the kind of teenager Mayor Andy Otte was seeking when he created the student councilor job this fall. Otte said he hopes Jinez is the first among many volunteers from the high school to sit on the council.

"It's a win-win. There is no down side to it," Otte said. "I think it's good that we're providing another channel for the school district to get information out. For the students, it becomes a learning experience, forcing them to come, talk and vote."

The idea came to Mt. Angel from the tiny eastern Oregon town of Elgin. Otte met the town's mayor at a conference and learned about its long-running tradition of including a student on the council. He immediately initiated a similar program here, working with Kennedy High School Principal Sean Aker to select Jinez.

"In the future, though, we'll ask students to apply in the spring and come to the council so we can make a decision," Otte said.

He expects the council will benefit from a youthful perspective, maybe as much as Jinez will benefit

from real-life political experience. Such community service nicely rounds out his college application, although he has already been accepted to the University of Oregon and Portland State University, where he landed a presidential scholarship.

Wherever he goes, Jinez plans to study political science and psychology. The son of immigrants from Oaxaca, Mexico, he is the second person in his family to gain an education past middle school. His older brother graduated from Western Oregon University.

Jinez' favorite classes are AP physics, AP calculus and yearbook, where he's an editor and photographer. He's served on student government since his freshman year, is a member of the National Honor Society, and is on

the high school site council. As school-city liaison, he also attends monthly school board meetings.

In fact, Monday's city council session was Jinez's fourth meeting of the day. If that sounds hectic, he admits that it is, but he has a healthy solution for de-stressing that involves moving his feet — a lot.

He's a dedicated runner, competing in cross-country and track, and he's been known to put in 60 miles of training in a single week. He placed 12th in the state in the 800-meter race last spring, but he loves longer distances — such as the 5K — even more.

Often he'll train with friends, but he can also be seen running alone, using the miles to think through his day and plan for the next one.
