He excelled in his gardening and regularly collected blue ribbons at county fairs.

Fr. Eugene's priestly ministry took him to various locations in the Diocese of Boise. He served as chaplain to the sisters at Marymount Hermitage from 1987 to 1995, and as parish priest in Glenns Ferry 1995 to 2012, where he retired, returning to the Monastery of the Ascension in Jerome.
