

# Stayton firefighters host golf tourney to raise funds for Oregon Burn Center

Stayton Volunteer Firefighters announced that the 29th Annual Burn Center Golf Tournament will take place 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday, June 24, at Elkhorn Valley Golf Course, 32295 North Fork Road, Lyons.

Stayton Fire Chief Jack Carriger said over the past 28 years firefighters have raised more than \$114,000 for the Oregon Burn Center, funds that assist burn victims and their recovery. He said local firefighters working in conjunction with vendors and community supporters "makes a difference in people's lives and...makes this event successful."

In announcing the tournament, Carriger wrote:

"Raising money for the Oregon Burn Center is an important priority for firefighters. Throughout our careers, we are confronted with real-life tragedy and see first-

hand what fire can do to its victims. We also know it can happen to anyone in our community in a matter of seconds. That is why we are committed to supporting the Burn Center."

ger, who batted No. 7 in the order Wednesday, paced the offense with a 3-for-3 game and three RBI.

"Even if a couple of us are having a bad (hitting) day the rest of us pick it

up," Pranger said. "We're really good at working together."

In addition to their strong hitting and fielding, Kennedy has pitching depth. Freshman Grace Schaecher relieved Riedman to open the fifth inning and struck out the side. Because Gaston (13-9) was down by at least 10 runs after batting in the

fifth, the 10-run rule was invoked.

The Trojans have the nucleus of last year's team intact that lost to Pilot Rock in the state semifinals.

"It really boosts your confidence," Riedman said. "We have a lot of experience on our team and I think the depth will really help us in the long run."

In addition to Prancer's three-hit game, Riedman, junior first baseman Molly Jaeger and junior catcher Abby Frey had two hits apiece. Jaeger scored four runs.

Kennedy's only losses this season came against 3A teams.
