Teen rescued after fall at Tamolitch Falls Blue Pool

With a hiker falling 80 feet at Blue Pool and a teen getting lost near Clear Lake, this past weekend ended up being a busy two days for Linn County rescue teams.
On Saturday, Linn County Sheriff’s Office deputies responded to a rescue at the Tamolitch Falls Blue Pool.
Mikala Marquis, 19, of Eugene, lost her footing while hiking above Blue Pool.
She fell off the trail and tumbled about 80 feet down a steep embankment through brush.
The teen, who suffered non-life threatening injuries, was pulled to

safety and taken to Riverbend Hospital in Eugene.
The next day, the sheriff’s office also responded to a teen reported missing at the Clear Lake Resort.
Nallely Orozco-Mendoza, 19, of Pasco, Washington, went missing from her lakeside cabin. Following an argument with her boyfriend, she walked into the woods to calm down.
After walking an unknown distance into the woods, she realized it was too dark to find her way back to the cabin.
Several deputies and three Linn County Search and Rescue team members began searching for her early Sunday morning.
Orozco-Mendoza spent the

night in the woods and found her way back to camp at daylight.
Linn County Sheriff’s Office officials said calls for service have increased dramatically at Blue Pool, with several serious injuries involving cliff jumpers leaping into the pool’s chilly waters.
They reminded anyone hiking at Blue Pool to use extreme caution when hiking and asked that people not jump from the rocks into the water.

MERIT workshops designed to facilitate self-employment

Stayton is one of eight communities in the mid-Willamette Valley scheduled to host a MicroEnterprise Resources, Initiatives, and Training (MERIT) workshop designed to facilitate self-employment.
The workshop, Work for Yourself@50+, is funded through an AARP Foundation grant and will be held at a number of locations in the coming months, including Salem, Independence, Dallas, McMinnville, Woodburn, Stayton, Keizer and Albany.
Stayton’s workshop will be 10 to 11:30 a.m. Friday, Sept. 15, in the public library’s E.G. Siegmund Room, 515 First Ave.
MERIT officials said the grant and workshops are designed to help vulnerable older adults assess opportunities for self-employment, build skills, and connect with resources that will enable them to generate income by working for themselves.

“For many low-income older adults, self-employment and business ownership is an opportunity to change their future,” said Senior Vice President of AARP Foundation Programs Emily Allen. “AARP Foundation is proud to work with organizations like MERIT who are committed to helping older adults successfully run their own business. Our Work for Yourself@50+ program is designed to enable older adults to pursue self-employment by connecting them with trustworthy resources in their own communities.”
That weaves well with MERIT’s ongoing objective of offering education and support to help individuals develop and execute business ideas in Marion, Polk and Yamhill

counties. Since 2004 the non-profit has focused its training and technical assistance on people with limited resources.
“The goal of our organization is to help people increase income and personal assets using self-employment as the means of doing that,” said MERIT Executive Director Forrest Peck.
This project emerged after AARP Foundation, supported by The Hartford, identified organizations such as MERIT in high-need communities to implement Work for Yourself@50+. AARP officials said the workshops should help low-income adults age 50 and older to understand the pros and cons of

self-employment and guide them through initial steps in achieving that.
“The Hartford is excited to work together with AARP Foundation on the Work for Yourself@50+ program, empowering mature adults to build on their potential and to prevail as independent entrepreneurs,” said Diane Cantello, head of corporate sustainability for The Hartford. “Self-employment creates small businesses that contribute to the stability and vitality of their local communities.”

Open house to highlight new Detroit visitor portal, bike path, other amenities

Anyone interested in catching a glimpse of the improvements in store around Detroit Lake may want to mark this date on their calendar.
An open house to review the draft designs of a new visitor portal, restroom and bike path along with improvements to the Detroit Flats day-use area will take place from 5:30 to 7 p.m. Monday, Aug. 28, at the Detroit Ranger Station, 44125 N. Santiam Highway 22, Detroit.
The Federal Highway Administration and the city of Detroit join

the Ranger District in hosting the open house, which will highlight a project that has been developing over several years. The new facility will be located at the site of the former Detroit Elementary School, on Patton Road just west of Highway 22.
Jude McHugh of the U.S. Forest Service noted that the project was initiated three years ago when students from the University of Oregon collaborated with local residents “to explore options for improving the local tourism economy as well as access to recreation opportunities.”
Plans developed from there and included applying for and receiv-

ing federal funds. The project is expected to break ground in May 2018 with an anticipated September 2018 completion.
A USDOT Federal Highway Administration webpage devoted to the project states:
“This project provides the critical linkages between the town and surrounding federal lands and recreation opportunities by constructing a visitor portal and enhancing an existing day use facility that will serve as a launch point for the tens of thousands of scenic bikeway users, participants in recreation events, and out-of-town visitors to Detroit Lake and all the nearby recreation opportunities.”
