woman Lauren Bennett said. "We are taking three spillway gates out and conducting rehab work on two of them. This means the gates wouldn't be able to hold back any water. Since we have fewer gates operational from now until mid-January, we decided it would be best to act conservatively and draw down the reservoir low enough that we could capture any potential storm event from now until mid-January."

The primary purpose of Detroit Lake is flood control, and by making the reservoir that low, officials say they can still limit a potential flood from hitting the North Santiam River and Willamette Valley.

Even so, the news was disappointing to local anglers who often get their limit at Detroit in winter. "It's disappointing,"
