4 NEW RESTAURANTS and the return of an old favorite

Just over a month into 2022, Salem's food scene is already buzzing with activity, from restaurant openings and reopenings to expansions. Against the odds of the pandemic, here's the latest.

Miyoko Buffet

The highly anticipated Japanese buffet next to El Torito Supermarket on Lancaster Drive Northeast is finally open. For the past six months, owners Mei Chan and Wei Zheng were waiting to open but had to push the date back due to equipment delays and issues with getting set up inside.

Miyoko is Chan and Zheng's second family affair, as both have owned — and still run — Corvallis' New China Buffet for the past 17 years.

Though folks online have expressed concern about a buffet opening during the pandemic, "we've found people are still coming out and want to eat," Justin Yang, Chan's son, said.

The buffet offers sushi, Mongolian grill and some Chinese food. It opened Feb. 4 to a roaring reception. Lunch buffet is \$12.99 per adult, and available 11 a.m. to 3:20 p.m. Monday through Friday, dinner buffet is \$16.99 per adult and offered 3:30-9:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and on Fridays until 10 p.m. Weekend buffet is \$18.99 per adult and goes from 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Seniors and children have reduced pricing. The Chubby Bean

The Chubby Bean, a coffee and breakfast plus Mexican food drive-thru stand on Portland Road, has reopened after temporarily closing in August. The Chubby Bean

offers a full range of espresso drinks, energy drinks and smoothies plus breakfast sandwiches, breakfast burritos and bagels.

The menu will be expanding in the coming weeks, with daily specials detailed on their Facebook page. Operating hours are 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily.

The Shaka Brah Grilled Cheese

When the Shaka Brah food truck first opened in 2019, grilled cheese and shaved ice were the staples on the menu. Shortly after, the Hawaiian food truck pivoted to primarily sell Hawaiian foods like shoyu chicken, kalua pig, ono short ribs, spam musubi with macaroni salad and rice, along with shaved ice.

Owner Jake Doan said since the truck at Divine Distillers is no longer operating, he's turned it into a dedicated grilled cheese and hotdog/Polish sausage truck. Parked at Shades of Brew Taphouse, the new truck will officially open Feb. 17. For those who still want Shaka Brah's Hawaiian foods, that cart is parked to its left. The site contains a total area of 40.97 acres. 1.6 acres of the site will be developed with 6 lots ranging in size from 10,444 to 16462 square feet.
