quarter, the Wildcats flipped the script at the hands of Maxim Wu and Enzo Chimienti.

Wu's three-pointer gave the Wildcats a 17-15 lead with 2:31 left in the quarter, but Chimienti's six points in the final minute extended the team's lead by six.

"We had some really good looks second half," Jamie McCarty said. "Five point-blank lay-ins, but they didn't go. That's the difference."

The Wildcats never gave up their lead in the fourth quarter, even extending it as far as 10 points at 31-21 with 2:33 left. The Foxes squeezed closer with a basket from Neil Efimov and several free throws from Jordan McCarty. But Efimov's three-pointer making it 34-30 came with only 4 seconds left.

Jordan McCarty lead the Foxes with 11 points and three assists while Redman-Brown, who earned player of the game honors, contribute nine points, seven rebounds and one assist.

Chimienti led the Wildcats with 15 points while Logan Thebiay and Kallen Gutridge each contributed six points. Wu earned player of the game honors.

WARRENTON - February 28, 1949 – March 8, 2022

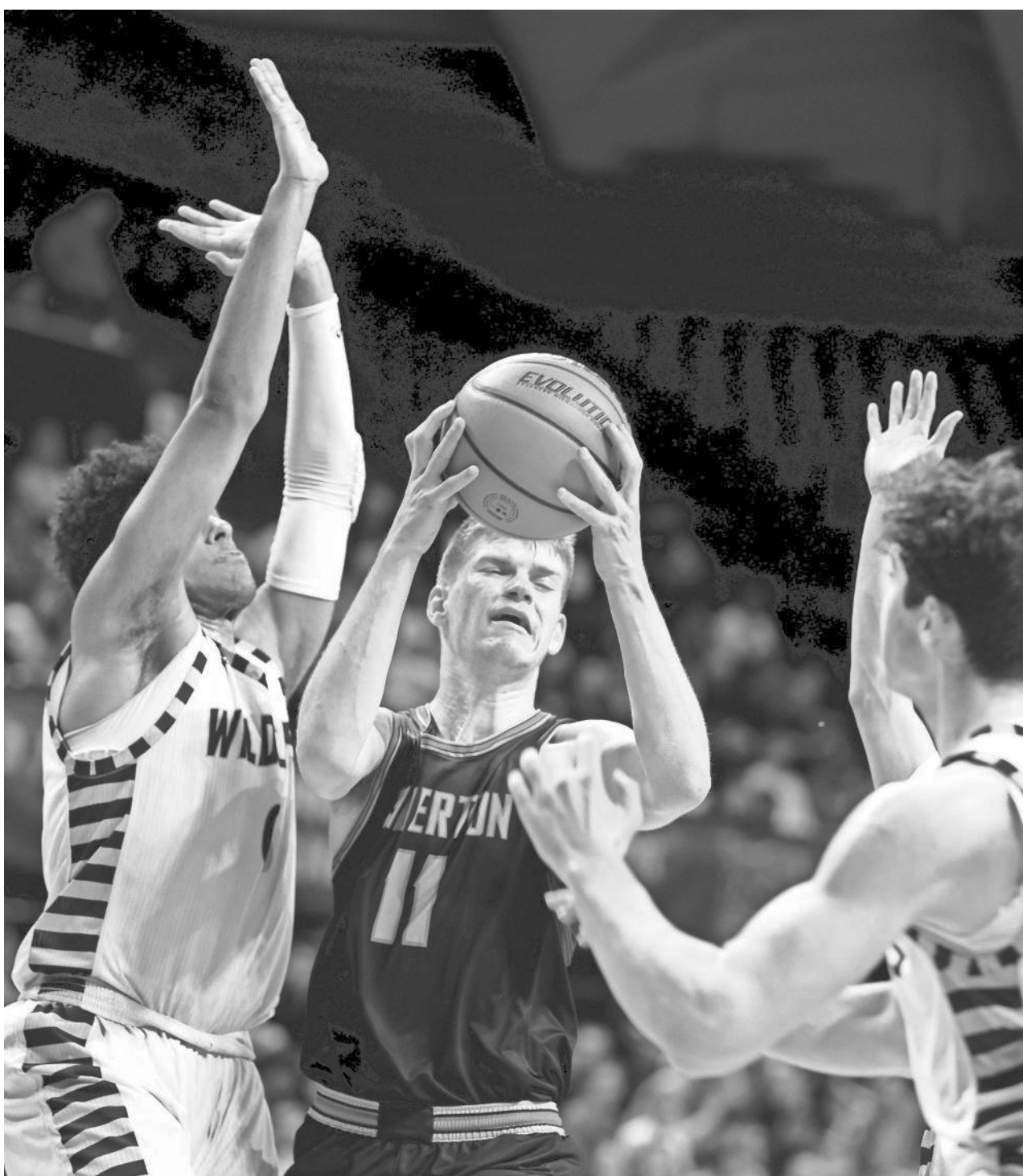
