PREPARE FOR ELECTION

Next June the electors of Union county will select at the polls many officers, and clothe them with great powers in the management of state and county affairs.

The future of the county will be shaped largely by the character and ability of the men the people select to manage their business. After a citizen has cast his vote on election day next June, practically he has no further power in public matters, he has transferred all to the chosen custodians thereof, the officers elect, and for two years these officers can follow their own sweet will, even constitutional limitations have no potency to thwart official will. This is demonstrated by our county indebtedness which in palpable disregard of the constitution of Oregon has grown to about \$200,000, when that in-

strument limits county indebtedness to \$5000. Other habitual violations of the state constitution can be pointed out, but will not be at this time. It is manifest that if a citizen desires to have helpful laws passed and executed he should know the opinions and ability of the men he clothes with power to make laws and arms with authority to enforce those made.

The safest plan for the citizen to do before he transfers all his political power, that is power as a citizen, to be exercised by another is to know the man he thus robes with irrevocable authority to do and act for him from two to four years. So long as the voters go on voting men into places of power whose opinions, convictions and fitness for the position they know nothing, and so long as men, who from their studies, habits and manly make ups have formed pronounced opinions on public questions are discarded at the polls, and "pigs in the poke" fellows; that is men who have no opinions, or if they have do not express them are given authority to do as they please, and no man before election knows what that pleasure will be, just so long will things go on as now, and the people be heavily taxed to effectuate schemes they never dreamed of until after election day.
