Portland Politics

The Republican City and County Committee consisting of 70 members, 64 of whom held their first meeting for nearly two years in Portland Oregon, on the evening of January 20 and took strong grounds for the re-election of President Roosevelt and Senator Mitchell.

The Oregonian of the 21st publishes the following as the manifesto issued by the committee.

The Republican City and County Committee announces to the people of the City of Portland and Multnomah County that the primary election will be held some time near the first of April, at a date to be fixed by the County Clerk. Voters residing in the city must register to entitle them to vote. The registry is now open at the Courthouse.

The vital question to be determined by the Republican party at the primaries are whether a delegation favorable to the nomination of President Roosevelt will be sent from Oregon to the National Republican Convention at Chicago, and whether Senator John H. Mitchell, of Oregon, will be elected to another term in the United States Senate.

This committee hereby declares most emphatically in favor of both President Roosevelt and Senator Mitchell, and, so far as the committee can properly do so, it pledges the delegates upon the regular ticket to be voted upon at the primaries to their support.
