### OUR TRADE WITH ASIA

A two line local item in the Union Republican reads "The Union Woolen Mills has received an order for fine blankets for a China liner." Short and laconic as this sentence is, it is full of meaning and brings up for consideration the Republican party's policy of fostering American manufactures, and also startles the inquiry as to the magnitude of our present trade with the Orient, and the hope it gives our flock masters, farmers and manufacturers of an increasing market for their surplus among the millions of people that dwell in Asia.

Of flour there were exported from the United States for the ten months ending with October to Japan 972,336 barrels valued at \$3,250,729. At the same time the exports of flour from the United States to the English port of Hong Kong were 1,047,931 barrels valued at \$3,808,023; to the Chinese Empire 50,862 barrels worth \$170,486; to British East Indies 555 barrels worth \$1,774; to British Australasia 452,480 barrels worth \$1,671,903, and to other countries in Asia and Oceania 420,743 barrels valued at \$1,577,703.

The grand total of flour exported from the United States to the Orient for the ten months

ending with October 1903, aggregated 2,944,907 barrels of the value of \$10,420,633. It is not necessary to state that the mills on the Pacific coast furnished their full share of this flour.

The total exports of domestic produce from the United States to the Orient during the year 1902 was \$96,204,562, and for the ten months ending with October 1903, in exports there were \$75,048,138 worth of stuffs.

The execution of Armstrong at Baker City has caused considerable comment regarding the justice and propriety of capital punishment. It is a question upon which some of the greatest minds in the nation have differed for many years and it will doubtless never be settled to the entire satisfaction of all the people.

We are pleased to note the seemingly general interest which is arising regarding the proposed Farmer's Institute. Union county farmers should all take part in this move and see that an institute is held and a good one. There is no reason why the entire winter should be allowed to pass without some gathering of the farmers, fruit men and stock growers where they could discuss topics of interest to each other and ex-

change ideas of mutual interest. Let each and every reader of the OBSERVER who will assist in this matter write to Hon. C. D. Huffman and inform him that you are interested in the matter and he will soon set the proper machinery in motion and there will be an institute held which will be a benefit and a credit to every farmer, fruit man and stock man in Union county.

From the message details it is supposed that Latham was riding the log onto a truck, when the chain gave way and the log rolled on him, crushing out his life.
