These booklets, pamphlets and advertising sheets are filled with cuts representing our scenery, products, towns and villages accompanied with copious write ups showing how generous nature has been in the make up of Oregon. All this is well and the enterprise that sends such forth is to be commended and the men and women who do the work are entitled to the highest honor for telling so ably and pleasantly what Oregon is, and what the people who are here have done to develop those wondrous qualities of soil, climate and scenery.

But there is one serious blunder which the people of Oregon have permitted to be made; that at this time, and for all future time until it is remedied, will counteract all the truthful and beautifully expressed things about Oregon. The blunder is nearly every county and incorporated place in the state has, from sheer neglect on the part of citizens thereof, become loaded with a heavy indebtedness, and the manner of doing public business is so expensive that taxes are unreasonably high.
