ENGLISH PARLIAMENT
 English parliament does.

The parliament that opens today bids fair to be one of more than ordinary interest not only to the British Empire but to the whole world. Since the English parliament dissolved last June great political changes have taken place in the United Kingdom; the cabinet has been entirely reconstructed; a great discussion of the tariff has taken place with the result that the old party lines have been obliterated. The new parliament will have to adjust in some way the contentions of seven earnest factions, namely:

The followers of Prime Minister Balfour, who favor a policy of retaliation, but who object to protection.

The Chamberlain party who favor a protective tariff.

The out and out Cobden Free Traders. The Liberals who are split, one part insisting on home rule and the other ignoring home rule.

The Labor party. The Irish party and the Conserva tive party.

It will be seen from the above that the people of the United States have more than a sentimental interest in the English parliament.
