GOOD HIGHWAYS.

The rapidity with which the senti-ment in favor of national aid to the common roads of the country has spread and the eagerness with which Introduction of the Browniow bill in gratifying to the friends of the mean ure, but surprising and astonishing to its opponents. The truth is the great body of the farmers of the land slow in demanding what they are Just ly entitled to. Had the same necessit as the want of good roads among farm ers existed in relation to the manufac turing, mining or commercial interests of the country such a necessity would have long since been recognized and met by adequate appropriations from

rongress.

The tillers of the soil do not work in concert for their own advancement. By the cersus of 1900 the whole number of people above the age of ten years en gaged in gainful occupations in the United States was 29,974,117. Of this number 10,381,765 were engaged in ag-ricultural pursuits. No other specified occupation employs so many. The manufacturing and mechanical pursuits



THAVELING UNDER DIPPICULTUS employ 7,085,902 persons, trade and transportation 4.760.964 and profes-sional service 1,258.739. And yet the farmers of the country, that contribute more to its permanent prosperity than all other classes combined, have the smallest amount of consideration in the unatter of congressional appropriations. In all the history of the past legisla-tion of the country but few efforts have been made to equalize the bene-tits of congressional appropriations. Until the rural mail routes were estatelished & citizen living in the country

rarely received direct benefits from the money expended by the general keyernment except that for the agricultural department. The commerce of the country felt the exuberance of fresh and lusty life and vigor from the improvement of the rivers and hariners but this exuberance would have been eastly increased had half the money appropriated for rivers and harbors been applied to aid in the improvem and maintenance of the public roads, the very foundation of commerce.


