How to Drive Away Insects.

Bits of raw cotton or wadding saturated with the oil of pennyroyal and placed in corners, on closet shelves and in boxes or drawers will drive away several kinds of objectionable insects, cockroaches, ants, etc., says the Woman's Home Companion. Placed in a saucer in the windows, it will help drive away flies. Saturated pads of the pennyroyal placed between the mattress and around the bed will drive away the plague not given in the list of those with which insects were scourged for berms. For this dreadful pest another excellent preventive and cure is an application to infested places of equal parts of kerosene and spirits of turpentine. Put the solution in the joints and cracks of the bed, about the surface and in any other places where the insects have found lodgment and all all cracks with hard soap that can be so treated. This is an old fashioned and reliable remedy.

How to Make Cham Bouillon.

Cham a pint of clam fine and put them over the fire in a porcelain lined soup tureen with their liquor. Simmer for five minutes; then add a pint of water, a dash each of mace, paprika and celery salt, strain, pour into cups and put a spoonful of whipped cream upon the surface of each cup of the bouillon.

How to Cure For Hard Wood Floors.

For those who understand how to cure for hard wood floors. Simple or elegant, there is but one mode of treatment. Never put a drop of oil of any kind upon them. If soiled, rub them off thoroughly with a flannel cloth wet with turpentine. When dry, apply a preparation of wax. When this is finished and dry, polish them with a cloth or brush made for the purpose until clear and shining, as the quality of the floor will admit. This carefully done will keep a wooden floor in perfect condition.

One sound of uncolored gelatin glue, as free from grease as possible, is soaked over night in cold water sufficient to cover the glue, says the Painter's Magazine. Thirty pounds of English cliff stone parts white, boiled or best boiled gliders' whitening, is also soaked in sufficient water to make a paste over night, and next morning both are heated with steam or over a moderate fire in a water bath to the boiling point, and when the glue is thoroughly raised. In summer time, dissolve a small portion of carbolic acid, say about one-eighth of an ounce diluted with water, is added for each pound of glue used in the aforesaid formula to keep it from souring, and in this way the calcimine will keep for some weeks. It is said that the work men refuse this preparation because of its working properties.
