On Jan. 1, 1904 there were \$51.30 cents per head on an average, in atl \$10,921.521; of mules there were 6,944, valued at \$338,824; milch cows 136,199 valued at \$4,094,142; other cattle 575,744 valued at \$9,354,628; sheep, 2,927,198, valued at \$5 976, 461; swine, 274,421 valued at \$1,577,921.

The several values foot up to \$32,283,527. This is \$18,742. 678 more than the Oregon Assessors made the live stock o the state worth when they made the assessment in the summe of 1903.

There is also a wide difference in the number of animals found. The assessors found 167,743 horses and mules, tho the men who collected the date for the U. S.
