Frank L Moore of Baker City was in the city yesterday. Mr Moore is a candidate for the nomination of the Union County judgeship.

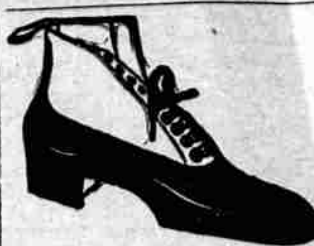

San Francisco, Feb 19—The attorney for F A Hyde, one of the men indicted in connection with the land frauds, will make a determined fight to keep his client from being taken to Washington.

Hyde is now at liberty, having furnished \$10,000 bail. H P Dimond, also indicted, has furnished bail in the same amount.

Both men will be given a hearing Wednesday before the United States commissioner. Hyde's attorney will attempt to show that if any fraudulent conspiracy existed, it was formed at Washington, and Hyde knew nothing about it.
