**Portland Markets**  
The Portland wheat market continues its firmness but no changes in quotations were made during the week. As a result of the strength of the wheat market flour is quoted firmer with the demand larger. The oriental business is not over large but some ordinary buys are reported. Prices there are just high enough to admit of a sufficient profit to ship.  
WHEAT—Walla Walla, 73c; blue-stem, 78c; Valley, 79c.  
BALLEYS—Feed, \$20 per ton, bringing \$20; rolled \$21.  
FLOUR—Valley, \$3.75 and 3.85 per barrel; but wheat straight, \$3.90 and 4.10; clear, \$3.55 and 3.75; hard wheat patents, \$4.20 and 4.30; Dakota hard wheat, \$4.90 and \$5.50; grain, \$3.75, whole wheat, \$4; rye wheat, \$4.50 and 4.75.  
OATS—No. 1 white, \$1.07; gray \$1.05 per cental.  
MILLSTUFFS—Bran, \$18 per ton; middlings, \$23; shorts, \$19; chop, U. S. mills, \$18; linseed, dairy food \$19.  
HAY—Timothy, \$16 per ton; clover, \$12; grain, \$12; cheat, \$13.

When the shipment is completed Mr. McKennon will have shipped 47 car loads and seven car loads of apples while potatoe shipments to this section have been more or less extensive for several years this is the first season that we have been able to ship apples into the heart of the greatest apple producing section of the United States.
