The city should plant a few
trees along the banks of the
beautiful lake which adorns the
landscape near the city hall,
and provide a small pleasure
boat for the benefit of those who
delight in the pleasure of boat
riding. Even if the city does
not deem it advisable to plant
shade trees along the boarder
of this beautiful sheet of water,
it should at least provide some
sort of a boat so that in case
some stranger who is not famil-
iar with the presence of this in-
land sea should fall off the side-
walk, he could be rescued and
thereby save the city the ex-
pense of a funeral.

The citizens of this county
should not let the matter of
making the Bothe lane fit for
travel drop. It is a matter of
great importance to the entire
county that this roadway be
made passable.

The greater part of the travel
of the county must pass over
this road, and the number of
horse power required to move
the load for the whole trip is
regulated by this mile or so of
soft road. The approaches to
this lane at both ends are at all
seasons of the year in fairly
good condition and if this one
lane was properly gravelled and
drained it would save much
time and expense to the farm-
ers and traveling public.

Now is the time for the prop-
erty owners of this city to be-
gin to think about planting
shade trees. A few trees along
the residence streets of a city
make the place look more home-
like and gives the appearance
of permanency. It is a com-
mon saying that the average
western town is composed of
only those who expect to stay
long enough to make a stake
and then move away. This has
been true to a more or less ex-
tent in the past, but that time
is passed so far as it regards
La Grande, and all that is now
necessary is to demonstrate this
fact by making the proper show-
ing. Trees along the streets
will also add much to the beauty
of the city.

Indoor base ball seems to
have taken a firm hold upon
the young men of this city.
This is well. The game is one
in which the young man may
secure all the exercise necessary
to keep his muscles in proper
form and at the same time train
his eye and brain to quick and
decisive action. Indoor base
ball is played, as the name im-
plies, under cover and therefore
can be played rain or shine.
The rules governing the game
are similar to those which gov-
ern the outdoor game, with the
exception that the players are
prohibited from talking back to
the umpire. This puts an
everlasting stop to the "rag
chewing" which usually form
one of the features of the sum-
mer game.

Stewart Coming

Oliver W Stewart, chairman of the
National Prohibition Committee will
speak in this city on March 9th in the
Central church of Christ.

bition member of the legislature in the
Illinois and is spoken of in the high-
