



tee is offered to the Governor free from any conditions so that the control of the State Committee is also in his hands, it is beleived Governor Odell will consent to take charge of the Naional campaign, deputing to a subor-

Berlin, March 2 .- The Taegliche Bundschan reports that Russia is on the verge of a revolution. Minister of the Interior Plehve regards the peasantry as the most dangerous condition.

The starving rustics, maddened by the excessive use of vodke are plundering estates and murdering the land owners. The government has proclaimed a minor state of seige and mild form of matial law in 53 of the 71 provinces of Europen Russia.

RELATING TO MEDIATION.

London March 2 .- It is learned this evening on the highest diplomatic authority that no overtures have been made to either Japan or Russia relative to mediation If such overtures should be made, it is understood Japan will give them careful attention and possibly agree to them, if assured her vital interests will be sufficiently protected.
