Washington, March 2.—The senate committee on postoffices held a meeting today and it is charged that certain of the Republican members left the room in order to break the quorum and thereby prevent the possible adoption of a resolution providing for an exhaustive investigation of the postoffice department. The accusation has caused a sensation and has revived the rumors that the disclosure of fraud already made have left many of the chief offenders undiscovered.

Washington.—United States Marshal Matthew, of Portland, has recommended appointment of L. N. Blowers, of Hood River, as Deputy Marshal to succeed Al Roberts, recently appointed Receiver of the La Grande Land Office. Blowers bears indorsement of the Oregon delegation.


