The Paschal Moon.

The Paschal moon, which regulates the time of Easter Sunday, appeared bright and clear in the heavens last night. It is the first full moon after the spring equinox. Easter Sunday is the first Sunday after the paschal moon. The name "paschal" comes from the Hebrew, meaning "passover," Christ was crucified at the time of the pasover, and it always comes with the Hebrews on the day after the first full moon after the equinox. Christ rose from the dead on the third day after the pasover, which gives us our Easter Sunday.
