THIS IS EASTER

Of all Christian fete days, Easter Sunday is the most universally observed throughout the Christian world. This morning people, numbered by hundreds of millions throughout the world, will rise with the Easter greeting upon their tongues and gladness in their hearts. No Christian ceremony has so much in it that appeals to the social feelings, affections and home life of the people as does that of Easter. It revives the song of joy of "Peace on Earth and good will to Men" sang by angels amid the starry glory of a Chaldean sky, hushed by the awful tragedy of Calvary and makes the Christian's heart throb for joy at the assurance of the resurrection and individual life everlasting and their lips open and send forth the same song of "good will to men." The great bell of Moscow in autocratic Russia peals for the same joyous song of good will and equality of man and for that day all rank is forgotten and ladies of the greatest title robed in silks and glittering with jewels, exchange Easter greetings with and bestow the Easter kiss upon peasants clad in sheep skins, with the same cordiality as with great lords and decorated nobles. The emperor of Germany washes the feet of aged peasants in demonstration of the great doctrine that "in Christ all are free" and

therefore equal. The President of the United States forgets his high position and great responsibility and on Easter day "comes as a little child" and watches with pleasure the group of small boys who gather from small homes to play their games with Easter eggs in the White House grounds, as is a custom of long standing at Washington. Easter is the one, and the only, democratic ceremonial universally observed by the Christian world. Its popular observance is based on the hope inborn in the human soul for bettering the condition of human life on earth, and a happy immortality.

"Then let us pray that come it may,

As come it will for all that;
That sense and worth, o'er all the earth,

May bear the prize, and all that.

For all that, and all that,
It's coming yet for all that,
That man to man the world o'er
Shall brother be for all that."
