Fiv. Drown in the gulf

Tampa, Fla, April 7.—Five persons all members of a pleasure party from the Florida Methodist college at Sutherland, on the west coast of the gulf, 30 miles west of Tampa, were drowned Anolote lighthouse last night.

The dead, Mrs. Walker, wife of the president of the college, Miss O'Connor of Atlanta Ga., Miss Slaughter of Sutherland, Miss McCray of Sutherland; Mr. Bouland of Sutherland.

President Walker and Miss Newton reached the beach alive. The bodies of Mrs Walker and Miss O'Connor have not been recovered.—The bodies of the other three who lost their lives were washed ashore and recovered.

President Walker had taken the party out for a cruise to the lighthouse, but met with rough water and the boat was overturned in the gulf.

Levee May Break

Pendleton, Or: April 7.—The high water that has been prevalent in the Eastern part of the state for the past few weeks has undermined the levee along the Umatilla River in this city, and in one place the strapping of heavy stone has tumbled into the river for a distance of 30 feet or more.

The street committee of the City Council is making every effort to have the defect remedied as soon as possible, for if high water mark should now be reached by the river it would in all probability, cut through the levee at the point where the rock has been displaced and flood that part of the city. There is a great deal of timber in the mountains, and it is feared that the river will reach a high stage before the Spring is over.

Horsemobile.

Roseville, Idaho: April 7.—E. J. Splitter has invented a unique conveyance which he terms a horsemobile. This novel machine is patterned after a genuine horse and is made of wood, iron, etc. It is propelled by either steam or gasoline and can attain a speed of 10 miles per hour. The inventor claims it can walk or trot along the road like this real article and can ascend or descend the steepest hill.
