A VALUABLE BOOK.

The OBSERVER received yesterday from the Statistical Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce and Labor, a valuable book of 650 pages full of figures showing the population, the occupations the people have followed from 1790 to 1900, and the exports and imports to and from foreign countries to 1903 and the products of the several states and much other data about schools, colleges, shipping and railroads.

The data is published to assist citizens in forming intelligent opinions on the many questions of public policies that come before them for approval or disapproval. To illustrate, take the labor question. In it we find that of the total population of 76,305,389, in 1900, there 29,084,117 of the people ten years old and over, that were engaged in some gainful occupation. Of these 10,331,765 were farmers. President John Mitchell, of the labor organizations, places the aggregate strength of the labor organizations in the United States at 2,000,000 which is less than ten per cent of the people in the United States engaged in some gainful occupation and only about one fifth as many as the Agriculturalists so far have not joined the labor movement.

The Department of Labor places the total population of the United States for 1903 at

80,372,000, the same year that Mr. John Mitchell placed the total number of persons belonging to labor organizations at 2,000,000. This indicates that the persons belonging to the various labor organizations in the United States constitute less than one fortieth of the whole people.

In 1900 there were 18,918,697 white males of voting age in the United States or more than nine votes to every member of the labor union.

The ticket nominated at the convention April 7 is one which should receive the support of every Republican in the county, and it is safe to say it will. Union county is Republican by at least two hundred and therefore the entire Republican ticket from top to bottom should be elected. If you are a Republican, lay aside all personal prejudices and do your part to elect a full Republican ticket. Try the experiment of filling the court house with Republicans and see how it would seem.

The Lewis and Clark bill passed the House Friday and will now go to the Senate. The bill provides for an appropriation of \$475,000, also provides for the coinage of 250,000 gold souvenir dollars which the exposition may sell at a profit.
