Indications now point to the success of the entire republican ticket in this county. There is no reason why every name on the ticket should not receive the support of every republican in the county. It was said by the Chronicle some time ago that the democrats would watch the republican situation and laugh, as no matter which faction of the party lost the convention the democrats would find strong allies in the losers either way. They should and no doubt will be disappointed in this hope. They have profited by this condition of affairs for years past but this year promises to witness a change, and it now looks like every office in the county will be filled by a republican.

It has been definitely decided by the State Board of Postage Railway Commissioners, composed of the Governor, Secretary of State and State Treasurer, that The Dalles-Celilo portage railway project, which the Legislature of 1903 appropriated \$165,000 to carry through will be abandoned until the arrangements pertaining to the construction of The Dalles Celilo Canal, for which the right-of-way is now in process of being secured for the Government, are completed.

The Republican nomination for district attorney seems to be

a difficult problem for the politicians to forecast. Some say Mr. Moore of Baker City is sure of it and others say Mr. Lowax of Union has it in his control. Either are well qualified and will conduct clean and creditable campaigns and will receive the support of the party if nominated. It will be decided today.
