

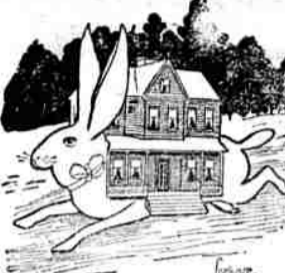

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned Recorder of the city of La Grande Union county Oregon will receive sealed bids for the sale of an issue of Twenty-five thousand dollars additional bonds of the city of La Grande Oregon until the 11th day of May A. D. 1904 at the hour of eight o'clock P.M. of said day. Said bonds to be of the denomination of Five hundred dollars each, and to be numbered from one to fifty inclusive and to bear date the 1st day of July 1904 and to bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year. Said bonds to be so drawn as to become due in twenty years from date thereof, and redemption after ten years from date thereof at the option of the city of La Grande, the principal and interest to be payable in U. S. gold coin at some place to be agreed upon by said city and the purchaser of said bonds, and to be designated therein.
