Ordinance No 287 Series of 1904

An ordinance repealing section two and amending section three of ordinance No 4 Series 1894 entitled, An ordinance relating to certain animals and fowls and prohibiting their running at large within certain limits of the City of La Grande. Passed by the council on the 3rd day of May 1894 and approved by the mayor on the 5th day of May 1894.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:—

Section One:—That section two of ordinance No 4 Series 1894 entitled, An ordinance relating to certain animals and fowls and prohibiting their running at large within certain limits of the City of La Grande, passed by the council of said city on the 3rd day of May 1894 and approved by the mayor on the 5th day of May 1894 be and the same here-

Section Two:—That section three of ordinance No 4 Series 1894 entitled, "An ordinance relating to certain animals and fowls and prohibiting their running at large within certain limits of the City of La Grande, passed by the council of said city on the 3rd day of May 1894 and approved by the mayor on the 5th day of May 1894 be and the same here-

Section Three:—Any animal or fowl described in Section one of this ordinance found running at large within the city limits of this city may be taken up by the marshal or street superintendent and impounded in a pound or enclosure. Such animal or fowl shall be provided with proper care, food and water while so confined.

Section Four:—That this ordinance shall be published in the La Grande Morning Observer for one issue thereof and shall be in full force and take effect from and after the 28th day of April 1904. Passed by the council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 18th day of April 1904 by six members voting therefor.
