Homer Davenport Receives a Warm Reception in Portland Where He Lectures to an Exceptionally Large Audience.

Of Homer Davenport's lecture in Portland which will be given here on the night of the 28th, the Portland Oregonian says:
"When Homer Davenport was presented to his audience at the Marquam last evening a whole theater full of people spontaneously applauded until it seemed that the lecturer would never be allowed to proceed. It was not a hearty, sincere ovation that the man who prompted it stood mute for minutes with trembling lips and tears in his eyes. As fine an audience as ever welcomed a public speaker to Portland was present to greet the son of whom

Oregon is so justly proud. Davenport's speech will never be printed in the school books or reproduced on a graphophone record. It is too original and requires the man's personality too much to go into the picky barrel of fame. He has avoided the dust of the beaten path which the bureau lecturers have traveled since Wendell Phillips. He has out-crowded and waded through the fresh herbage of greener pastures, but he has arrived beyond a cavil. The Davenport lecture is as refreshing as the woods in June. It has picturesqueness and pith and point. It is altogether worth while.

HIS DEATH ENDS THE PROSECUTION

Editor Harryman, Charged With Dynamiting the Long Creek Ranger Dies of Consumption, Thus Ending the Prosecution

There has been a sudden and unexpected termination to the prosecution of O. W. Harryman of Long Creek, on the charge of dynamiting the office of the Long Creek Ranger. Mr. Harryman is dead, a victim of consumption. Any knowledge which he might have possessed as to guilt or innocence of suspected parties in blowing up the Ranger office was buried with him for

he made no statement before he died. Mr. Harryman was editor of the Long Creek Light and was out under \$500 bonds to appear before the judge of the circuit court of Grant county next month and answer to the charge of dynamiting the Ranger office. Just what evidence there was against Harryman is not known as it was collected by Detective Salvage of Portland.
