Port Arthur Now Completely Surrounded by Japs--Just by a Little Head Work.

Tokio May 7-General Hosoya, detailing the landing of Japanese troops on Lia Tung peninsula, in his official report, says the seventh division, with torpedo boats and two transports. arrived off Lai Tung the morning of May 5 bomberded a number of the enemy's patrols and landed a party of sailors who waded ashore a thousand yards and took possession of range of hills, planting the flag without a shot. Three gunboate were employed to distract the enemy's attention, killing several
