WALLACE TO BE CHIEF ENGINEER

General Manager of Illinois Central Accepts the Appointment as Chief Engineer of Canal Construction.

Washington, May 11—Admiral Walker, president of the Panama canal commission, received a telegram today from John Findley Wallace of Chicago, general manager of the Illinois Central railroad accepting the appointment of chief engineer in charge of the construction of the canal. Mr. Wallace will receive a salary of \$25,000 a year. Mr. Wallace will take up his work with the commission June 3rd.
