Court's Statement

Union, Oregon, May 9 1904.
To the Tax Payers and Voters of Union Co., Oregon:
In answer to the questions asked in relation to the question of removing the county seat from Union to La Grande, we respectfully say that should the question of changing the county seat be voted, at the next election, in favor of La Grande, we will not favor making the change if the change will cost the taxpayers of this county in excess of \$10 per annum for rent or at least fifteen years, of suitable buildings for all court purposes and county offices and county jail, and if the cost of transferring the offices and records from Union to La Grande will cost the taxpayers in excess of \$200, and we hereby publicly announce that we will oppose the change when voted in favor of La Grande, unless the interests of the tax payers are protected against any expense greater than herein stated.
