Peoria, Ill., June 4-An explosion warehouse of the Corning Distillery Company this aftergoon completely wrecked the building. The ruins immediately took fire and communicated to three adjoining buildings which were burned to the ground. Ten men were buried beneath the ruine and burned to death. Six others were seriously injured. The loss on the buildings and whiskey and spirits stored will approximate \$1,000,000.

This Bulliton presents the statistics or all mines and Quartes, petrolium and natural gas lines were in operation during any portion of the calcudar year ending Dec 31 1003. From it we learn that during that year there were 151, 516 mines, quaries and wells in opera-tion in the United States in which 46 823 operations were engaged employ-ing 28,128 Salaried officials and
