For The Army Posts

Washington, June 6—Secretary Taft today approved the allotments made by quartermaster for funds for the barracks and quarters at the various army posts and forts to be expended during the fiscal year beginning July 1st. The following amounts were allotted to the forts on the Pacific: Fort Worden, Washington, \$130,000; Fort Casey, Washington, \$53,000; enlarging the posts in Alaska, \$50,000; Boise Barracks, Idaho, \$248,750; Vancouver Barracks, Washington, \$39,000; Fort Lawton, Washington, \$19,950; Fort Walla Walla, Washington, \$90,000; Fort Wright, Oregon, \$14,000.
