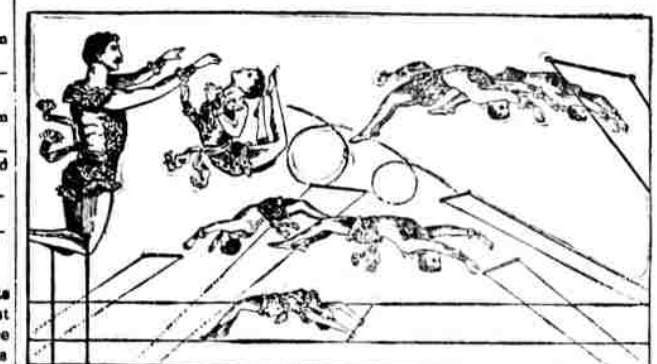

ROBBERS FIGHT

One Killed And: Posse
Think They Have The
Other One Now Sur-
rounded

New Castle, Colorado, June 10—A posse of ranchman and cowboys living in the neighborhood of Garfield west of this place came upon three men supposed to be the Denver and Rio Grande train robbers who dynamited the express car near Parachute, Colorado Tuesday night. A battle followed and one of the pursued was killed. The other two escaped into Garfield canyon and at last accounts were completely surrounded. It is thought escape is impossible. Elmer Chatman, a cowboy, received a slight flesh wound.

The dead man was brought to this place tonight and identified as one of the three men who worked several days last week on the D & R G section near Parachute under the name of J. H. Ross. Nothing is known of his history here.

Resigns

Portland, June 10—Postmaster Bancroft this evening telegraphed his resignation to Senator Mitchell at Washington. For some time past there has been much discussion in local postoffice affairs and several weeks ago it was reported that Bancroft would be asked to resign. The request for his resignation came today and was immediately complied with.
