General Results

The election returns from the state at large show that the state is republican by 20,000 majority the greatest in the history of the state. The socialists and prohibitionists have increased their vote slightly.

The democrats elected a great many county and district officials. The legislature is republican by large majority—in the senate 20 republicans and 0 democrats, and in the House 50 republicans and 10 democrats.

Local Option carried by a safe majority and the Primary Law by a very large majority.

Each county in the state shows a majority for the republican state ticket ranging from 100 in Linn to 10,000 in Multnomah.
Binger Herman is reelected by 7,000 majority. Williamson's majority is over 13,000.

Paralyzed

Pendleton, June 14—Mrs Martin McLaughlin, of North Fork was brought to the home of J A McClone yesterday evening suffering from an attack of paralysis and is now in a critical condition.

Mrs McLaughlin is a widow of Martin McLaughlin who was killed by being run over by a passenger train a couple of years ago.

Contract Awarded

At the meeting of the city council last night Jack Childs was awarded the contract for digging 10,000 feet of excavations for the new city pipe line and covering the same for 12 1/2 cts. per lineal foot.

Saloons Doomed.

Freewater Ore, June 14—After being a saloon town since its incorporation, Freewater will now probably be liquorless, since the carrying of the local option law in Oregon. The town is in a prohibition precinct, though in favor of saloons itself. The law provides that regulation of the liquor traffic shall be by precinct vote, consequently the outside influence can dictate in this matter to the citizens of the incorporation. A move to oust the Bozering and Kintucky, the town's two saloons, will probably be made this summer.

Much of the prohibition vote in Umatilla county, which is divided between 200 and 300, was drawn from north and south Milton precincts.
