Hood River Or., June 16—The Davidson Fruit Cannery has 100 women, children and men employed turning out half a carload of canned strawberries a day. The growers are paid from 1 to 3 cents a pound for the berries, according to grade. A new soldering machine has been installed, whereby 10,000 cans can be sealed in a day.

Nashville Tenn., June 15—The United Confederate Veterans today elected Lieut. General Stephen D. Lee, of Columbus Mass., commander-in-chief and Gen. I. W. L. Cabell of Dallas, Texas, commander of the trans-Mississippi post.

REPUBLICAN NATIONAL WORK

Chicago June 15—Today marked the beginning of the republican national work. The first meeting was solely for the purpose of organization and the passage of resolutions on the death of Senators Hanna and Quay. Tomorrow the claims of the warring delegates will be taken up from eight o'clock. OREGON TIMBER AT ST. LOUIS.

Albert Tosier, secretary of the Oregon Press Association, returned yesterday from St. Louis where he attended the meeting of the National Press Association, says the Oregon Daily Journal. He states that the Oregon timber exhibit had not yet been completely arranged and a part of it will be set up outside of the building including a standing fir tree. The timber exhibits of Washington and Oregon are a creditable display of the timber resources of the Northwest and the cedar and yellow fir timber products of Oregon attract commendable attention. The cones from large trees show up the immensity of growth of Oregon forests in a creditable way.

Martial Law Is Declared

Denver, June 16—Governor Peabody today issued an order declaring martial law in San Martin county at an end, and instructing Captain Wells to turn Charles H. Moyer over to the civil authorities.

Peabody says this order was issued before he had any knowledge of the action today of Judge Thayer at St. Louis. It is understood, however, the order did not go into effect in San Miguel county until 9 o'clock tonight when publicly read by Wells.

About noon the newspaper men who had heard of the St. Louis proceeding apprised the attorney general of the matter, the latter hastened to the Governor's office and upon returning to his own quarters in the state house the attorney general said he was anxious to find out whether or not the order concerning the Telluride situation had gone forth. The point is raised as to whether the action of the governor in the Moyer matter places him in contempt of the order of Judge Thayer.
