**Flooding of a Pipe
Causes 34 Men to
Lose Their Lives in
Jamaica.**

Kingston, Jamaica, June 27.—The accidental flooding of a large pipe leading from the electrical plant to the river today resulted in the drowning of 34 men who were cleaning the pipe. Sixty-seven men were at work and only 16 were saved.

ANOTHER DESCIPLE SENT TO ASYLUM

Corvallis, June 28.—Mrs. O. V. Hurt, one of the ardent disciples of Christ, was taken to the asylum at Salem this afternoon by Deputy Sheriff Henderson. Her examination was held before Judge Walters this afternoon and she was adjudged insane. Only one of her Holy Roller band is left, Mrs. Hartley, and it is thought that she too will go insane.

Returned Home

Fred Hamilton, who was injured by falling from Passenger train No. 8 Sunday, returned from Huntington last evening. The first part of the night he rested easy but the latter part he was in considerable pain. It may require several days yet before it will be known whether or not he is seriously hurt. The appearances are that he is only badly bruised and when the soreness leaves him he may not be injured.

Trinidad, Colo., June 28.—An appeal for aid was issued today by the officers of the United Mine Workers and the history of the struggle which closes in an appeal to all organized labor and its sympathizers to contribute their mite to the end that organized labor may not be strangled in the state of Colorado.

Oakland, June 28.—Hon. Victor H. Metcalf left for Washington today to commence his duties as secretary of the department of commerce and labor.

Freight Car Burned.

As an O. R. & N. freight train east bound left the station at Haines Sunday about noon one of the cars loaded with hay waybilled to Huntington, was discovered on fire. There was nothing to do but switch off the car and leave it to its fate. This was done and the car was almost totally consumed.

Prostrated By Heat.

New York, June 28.—One hundred and eleven cases of prostration have been reported as the result of the excessive heat here today.

Agnes Emmett, a widow, was taken to the hospital this evening with 3 self-inflicted bullet wounds in her head. The woman said she was crazed by the heat.

Albert Kuski, 21 years of age, a sailor on the United States Steamship Honcock, was picked up on the street overcome by heat and taken to the hospital.

The temperature for the last 24 hours averaged 11 degrees higher than the average temperature for the last 25 years. At noon the thermometer registered 90 degrees.

HOTTEST PLACE IN J. S.

Washington, June 28.—According to the Weather Bureau figures, Washington was the hottest place in the United States, the thermometer reaching a maximum of 94 degrees. In Boston, also, it was very hot, the official temperature being 92 degrees.
