PHILIPPINE POLICY.

THE KEY NOTE.

In a speech of one hour and forty two minutes duration The Hon. John S. Williams leader of the Democracy in the House of Representatives, on taking the gavel as temporary chairman of the national Democratic convention at St. Louis on July 6, sounded the key note and gave a forecast of the campaign. That key note is an instruction to the Democratic orators and writers to abuse Roosevelt and Republican leaders. And it now looks as though the campaign will be conducted on that line by the Democrats.

This is the only sort of campaign the Democrats can conduct, for it has no policy on which its own leaders can unite, save the negative one of opposition to the Republicans, and to and every thing that party has done or proposes to do. Democracy proposes nothing. The sole purpose of its existence is to preserve the solid South as a political asset, to be enjoyed by the Southern country.

The grand ovation tendered William J. Bryan when he entered the convention yesterday will not be pleasant reading to those leaders who have for the past eight years been trying to read him out of the party. Mr. Bryan has a strong following and will be in evidence in the leadership of his party for many years.

Our next national campaign is now on. The two dominant parties have placed their candidates before the people and in

November the people will give expression as to their choice for chief executor of the leading nation of the world, for the next four years.

The national democratic convention has been well advertised as the coming attraction for many months and from all reports every feature advertised was there in evidence and possibly some that were not on the bills.

It must pay to advertise; if not, why should the tobacco trust spend \$100,000 in one year to proclaim the merits of a single brand of cigars and also renewing their contracts for another year.

Big Damages

The Dallas, July 8.—The Taffa case is proceeding slowly. The state completed its case by putting several mechanics on the stand to show the value of the Taffa plant at Dallas. This morning H. Taffa was put on the stand for the defense, and his testimony says the plant is worth \$200,000, and that the canal would entirely ruin it. The case will probably go to the jury tonight.

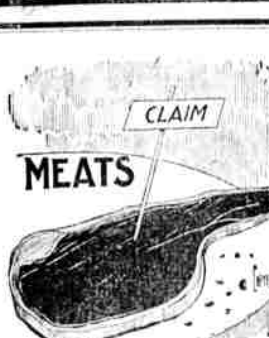
