### SERMON ON THE MOUNT.

Mr. Williams closed his hour and forty two minutes speech at the St. Louis convention with the following peroration.

"Above all and in conclusion, a good Democratic Administration will ponder and practice the simple precepts of Jefferson's first inaugural address. It is the political sermon on the Mount for Democratic Republicans."

It would be a judiciously half hour spent by our Democratic readers if they would read Jefferson's first inaugural and compare its precepts with the fulsome declarations of Mr. Williams. The reader after reading Jefferson's inaugural will wonder what one of his precepts he would have the Democratic Administration ponder over and practice, without being sure of incurring the wrath of the Democracy and especially that of Mr. Williams.

Mr. Williams gave Mr. Jefferson great credit for inaugurating territorial expansion. In his inaugural Jefferson evidently had no thought of expansion for he used these words "Possessing a chosen country with room enough for our descendants to the thousandth and thousandth generation," with all these blessings what more is necessary to make us a happy and prosperous people." Jefferson used these words on March 4 1801, and before the Louisiana purchase, and at a time when the area of the United States was but 827,841 square miles. The present area is 3,025,600 square miles.

In denouncing the intention expressed in the Republican platform to inquire into the constitutionality whereby several millions of citizens of the United States have been disfranchised in the Southern States in recent years. Mr. Williams in his key note speech used the following language: "Let not the business interest of the country deceive itself; let those controlling it prepare, if Roosevelt is elected on this platform, for another period of uncertainty, unrest, business disturbance and race war in the Southern States."

These are words of threat of what the Democracy of the south will do in case the majority of the voters pronounce in favor of the Republican platform.

What one of the simple precepts found in Jefferson's inaugural address Sanctions such a threat

of any act to carry it into effect?

We hope our readers will turn to the first inaugural of President Jefferson and diligently search for a precept that sanctions such a threat. Paragraph four of said inaugural address contain fourteen of what Mr. Jefferson deemed the essential principles of our government and consequently those which ought to shape its administration. Those fourteen essential principles, or precepts as Mr. Williams calls them, are as follows:

1—"Equal and exact justice to all men, of whatever state or persuasion, religious or political."

2—"Peace, commerce and honest friendship with all nations, entangling alliance with none."

3—"The support of the state governments in all their rights, as the most competent administration for our domestic concerns and the surest bulwark against anti-republican tendencies."

4—"The preservation of the General Government in its whole constitutional vigor, as the sheet anchor of our peace at home and safety abroad."

5—"A jealous care of the right of election by the people—a mild and safe correction of abuses which are lopped by the sword of revolution where peaceable remedies are not provided."

6—"Absolute acquiescence in the decision of the majority, the vital principle of republics, from which is no appeal but to force, the vital principle and immediate parent of despotism."

7—"A well disciplined militia, our best reliance in peace and for the first moments war, till regulars may relieve them."

8—"The supremacy of the civil over the military authority."

9—"Economy in the public expenses that labor may be lightly burthened."

10—"The honest payment of our debts and sacred preservation of the public faith."

11—"Encouragement of agriculture, and of commerce as its handmaid."

12—"The diffusion of information and arraignment of all abuses at the bar of public reason."

13—"Freedom of religion."

14—"Freedom of the press, and freedom of person under the protection of the habeas corpus, and trial by juries impartially selected."

Mr. Williams evidently did not expect either his hearers or readers to recall Jefferson's precepts of government or he would not have referred to them, because there is not a definite proposition in his long speech that is not at variance with Jefferson's precepts.

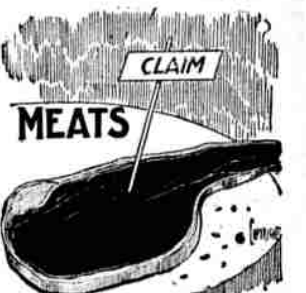
