Not Treated Fairly.

St. Louis July 13.—The second session of the National Association of Colored Women, which was to have convened today at the World's Fair grounds, met in a downtown church as the result of a resolution adopted at the instance of Mrs Booker T Washington. Mrs Washington opposed the meeting at the World's Fair on the grounds that the exposition directors' board discriminated against negro women in the matter of employment on the grounds, and against the race in general. The action was opposed by the St. Louis delegates, but after Mrs Washington had spoken in support of her resolution, declaring against the World's Fair meeting, it was adopted by a large majority.
